Definitions

1. Politics
 - a. “the art or science of government” – American Heritage Dictionary
 - b. Using power to get people to do things they would not otherwise do (the study of power)
 2. International Relations #1
 - a. Politics in the absence of a common sovereign
 3. Sovereignty
 - a. The sole legitimate right to use violence within a given geographic area
 - b. Acknowledging no higher power
 - c. Free from outside interference
 4. Anarchy
 - a. Describes international relations
 - b. No higher authority or government
 - c. Commonly associated with riots and chaos
 - d. There can be rules under anarchy that people follow
 - i. Example: a classroom with no professor, who is in charge? No one. We claim sovereignty, but there isn't chaos, there are established rules we all follow that dictate our actions
 5. International Relations #2
 - a. The factors and the activities which affect the external policies and the power of the basic units into which the world is divided (basic units are states)
